RANGE SAFETY TOPICS OF THE MONTH

Below are just a few things to think about before one chambers that first round of the day.

- Positively identify your target before firing at it.
- What's behind your target? Always make sure that a stray shot, or a bullet which hits its intended target, will be safely stopped.
- Never shoot at a hard surface, or at water -- your shot may glance off, ricochet and injure someone.
- Never shoot at glass bottles, living trees, or inappropriate targets that create a hazard for other persons or damage the environment.

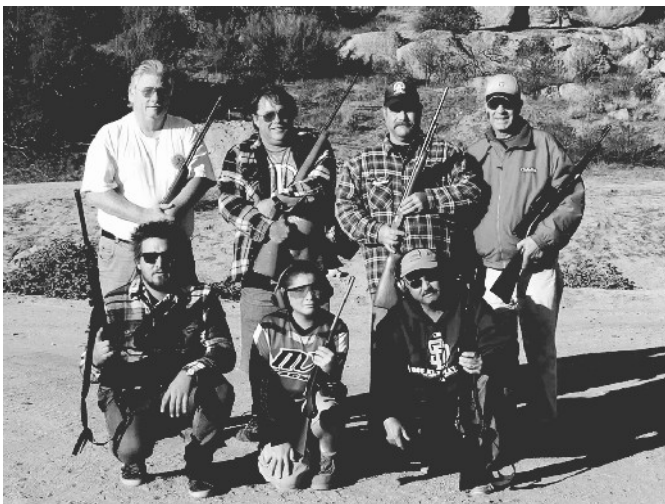
Old Business: By-law committee: We must get the committee going now.
